Interaction Norms for Collaboration in WashACT

- 1. Honor our in-person time together through active engagement during WashACT meetings.
- 2. Respect the diverse professions of WashACT members, as well as distinct roles and perspectives, and differences in capacity & experience/expertise levels.
- 3. Accurately and proactively acknowledge the accomplishments of other groups.
- 4. Call on each other when someone's experience is relevant regardless of past history.
- 5. When you have asked for someone's guidance and input, report back when possible.
- 6. Provide constructive feedback when asked and receive feedback as a gift.
- 7. When criticism seems necessary, confine it to the specific action/campaign/idea rather than undermining a group or member organization, or WashACT as a whole.
- 8. Confront challenges and provide constructive criticism face to face or on the phone.
